Golf Tournament 2013

Mark the date in your calendars! The Society's Annual Golf Tournament will be held on Saturday, 17th August at Carstairs Golf Club, with a start time of 1:00pm. Carstairs is a lovely 18 hole course that has something for all levels of golfer. There is some water, but not nearly as much as Boulder Creek where we were last year, and the fairways are wide and generally tree lined. Carstairs is North of Calgary, just off highway 2 but check Google or your GPS for directions from your home. The facility has both a driving range and a chipping and putting area where you can practice your skills before going on the course; it will **not** be a shotgun start this year. The cost is \$100 for members, and \$110 for non-members which is a little higher than last year. The price increase is due to the difficulty in finding a course that would entertain a relatively small group, general price increases in golf around Calgary and a slightly smaller subsidy from the Society due to budget constraints. Dinner only option is available for just under \$30. The registration form includes options around car sharing, so please consider this when you enter. We will do our best to organize requests, but it is very dependent on individual preferences and geography. Ideally we would like everyone at the course by 12.30pm but latest would be 30 mins before your tee time. Entry forms should be sent with the rele-

vant fees by Friday 9th August. NOTE: **only registrations (accompanied by payment) received by the deadline, will be entered.** This is important for getting numbers to the golf course, and also so that we can look at car pooling preferences and organise teams.
