Kirkin' of the Tartan

The Society hosted a Kirkin' of the Tartan at Knox United Church on Sunday, 14 June 2015. The service was conducted by Rev Linda Hunter and organist Chellan Hoffman. Knox Church was the first sandstone building constructed in Calgary in 1884 and once occupied the corner of Centre (McTavish) Street and 7th (McIntyre) Avenue. Knox was the centre of the Scottish community and in 1912, the church moved uptown to 4th (Ross) Street and 6th (Angus) Avenue. The service began with an organ prelude of Scottish songs and then a message of welcome which featured the history of the Scottish community, Knox Church and the



Society. The Procession of Tartans was introduced with 'Highland Cathedral' by the organ and pipers of the Society. The tartans were then blessed and the service proceeded with meaningful messages of community and Gaelic song from the Society Choir. The service concluded with 'Amazing Grace' from the pipes, organ and congregation and a social gathering in the church hall. The Society will be working to have this Kirkin' of the Tartan service as an annual event at Knox on the second Sunday of June in coming years.
