If you would like to give direct assistance (helper) to a Society member within your postal code area (ie T3C), such as getting groceries or taking them to the doctor's office. Volunteers will always have the option to decline a request. Assistance protocol will be given to each volunteer to minimize social contact.

If you would like to regularly (every four to five days) contact Society members (caller) who are in the vulnerable group to check on their condition. In addition to asking simple questions, this may involve chatting to re-assure anxious members, and also contacting Robert if a member requires assistance.

If any member is in need of assistance

In order to facilitate this program, your personal information, (name, phone number, email and address) will be shared with other Society members who will contact you. These members are contacting you to see if you need help and you can withdraw from this program at any time by telling the caller, or contacting contact Robert at <u>roberthenderson@yahoo.com</u> or 403-245-5514 with your postal code.

This pandemic will take its time and once the 'all clear' statement is made by health officials, this program will cease.

## Bylaw Changes Filed

The Society has received notice that the Bylaw amendments, presented and approved by Society members at a meeting specially called for that purpose on Saturday, 14 September, were filed by Service Alberta on 26 September 2019. The amendments were part of the scheduled five year review and added a clause regarding a Code of Conduct, establishment of a Nominating Committee with defined responsibilities, definition of Member spending authority, limits of director liability, a change in the period in which the AGM is held, and details on the election process as some members had previously demonstrated confusion on that process.
