
Society Burns Night 2025

Society Budget Meeting 2024

The weather was sunny and mild when the Society met on Saturday, 21 September at the capitol Hill Community Centre to review the budget for 2025 and other business. Twenty members were present at 4:30pm and Andrew Auchterlonie presented the budget which was approved. The next order of business was an amendment to a 2007 motion to increase the Highland Games Operating Grant by one thousand dollar. Cost have gone up across society and highland games need the extra, so the Society responded and the grant now stands at four thousand dollars per

annum per highland games. Members contributed \$35 to the benevolent Fund and the meeting was adjourned at 4:43pm. The meeting was followed by a Barbie where members brought salads and desserts to share while the Society provided hamburgers, hot dogs, chicken burgers, vegetarian burgers, haggis burgers and the condiments. Everyone had a good meal and moved on to the Scottish Country dance with Dennis Orr and Glen Morin. Ann Vanderwal put together a great dance program that was enjoyed by those present and finished off a good day for the Society.



Society History—140 years

The work to incorporate the town of Calgary as a municipality had been accomplished when the members of the Calgary Civic Committee received the Town Charter on 10 November 1884 and they turned their efforts to another community cornerstone. The initial meeting of the Calgary St. Andrew's Society was advertised in the Calgary herald and held 19 November 1884 at George Murdoch's shack in what is now Victoria Park. At that time it was determined that there was interest and the organizational meeting was held 21 November with George Murdoch elected President, Archibald McNeil First Vice President, J.G. McCallum Second Vice President, Thomas S Burns was the Secretary and credited with being the driving spirit behind the formation, Joseph Bannerman the



Treasurer, J. Douglas White the Sergeant at Arms, and, George Munro and McLeod the Pipers. The membership fee was fixed at \$2.00 and there were about thirty members. A committee was formed to draft the by-laws and the first dinner set for the Rossin House on Stephen Avenue Saturday 29 November 1884. It was decided to send greetings to the St Andrew's Society of Winnipeg on the evening of the dinner. The first dinner of the Society, for men only, did take place at the Rossin House, Archibald McNeil proprietor, and after the dinner, a great number of toasts were made, songs were sung and the crowd was entertained by piper, George Munro. The event broke up at about 11 o'clock.

Haggis Herders

From the archives comes a rare undated photograph of the Argyll Haggis Herders Gathering. The text goes on to report that Haggis is a prized commodity, rich in vitamins, minerals, and flavour. Herds once roamed across the country but now are limited to remote, secluded areas due their shy nature.

Glasgow Gaelic School

(Scottish Gaelic: Sgoil Ghàidhlig Ghlaschu) is a primary and secondary school in Glasgow Scotland which teaches through the medium of Scottish Gaelic. This teaching method is commonly known as Gaelic Medium Education. The secondary school catchment area serves the



whole of Glasgow and the primary school catchment is in the west of the city. More than 1300 students are enrolled in the Glasgow Gaelic Schools The former St James Primary in Calton will be turned into the city's fourth Gaelic school after council planners approved the project. Part of the old building will be refurbished and an extension created.
